These are the words of St Augustine, and are often quoted. 'Alleluia' is the Latin version of the word Hallelujah – a joyful praise of the Lord. It is used much in the Christian Liturgies of both East and West to give praise to God. It is used much in the Easter Liturgies.

In the Gospel of St John – ch.20 v 1-9, we read of the Resurrection o Jesus from the dead on Easter Morning – truly a day of the Lord.

After Jesus had been place in the tomb on Good Friday, Mary of Magdala went to the tomb on Easter morning, the stone had been rolled away from the tomb - and it was empty. By God's power, the stone was rolled back – "Jesus had risen".
