REMEMBRANCE OF THE DEAD – During the current Covid restrictions there will be no book/pen in St Mary's Church during November to record names of Deceased family. Please leave name of deceased in the IN MEMORIAM BOX now in the Sanctuary of the Church.

INDULGENCES – Due to the corona virus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups from forming where prohibited, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1 to 8 November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on **any day in November**, and prays for the faithful departed. This Indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed. Also Sacramental Confession, & Reception of Holy Communion should apply.

THE HOMEBOUND – For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including anti-Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence. In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain. These conditions are Sacramental Confession reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions.

FURTHER COVID-19 GUIDELINES issued by Department of Health for Nr. Ireland

1. **FACE COVERINGS** *It is mandatory in civil law that face coverings are worn when entering or leaving church and in church. The wearing of a face covering is mandatory unless a person has a reasonable excuse. For example a child under 13 years or a person leading a service in a place of worship or a couple at a ceremony to solemnise their marriage*
2. **FUNERAL OR WAKE** - *Indoor Gathering at Private Dwelling. It is illegal to attend a funeral or wake in a private dwelling*
3. **MARRIAGES** – *It is illegal to organise, or participate in a gathering of more than 25 persons for the purpose of solemnising a marriage*
4. **FUNERALS AND COMMITTALS** – *It is illegal to organise, operate or participate in a gathering of more than 25 persons for the purpose of a funeral or the committal of a body. It is only possible to view a body in a funeral home. A person responsible for organising or operating a funeral or associated event elsewhere must comply with the guidance on funerals issued by the Department of Health. Please mark bags for recycling making sure shoes, bedding etc are in a separate bag. We can only accept 3 bags from each household and cannot take CDs, DVDs, toys and larger items at this time. Sincere thanks to all involved in the shop. Pray that we will be able to keep the shop open in spite of the virus which surrounds us.
