Celebration in St Mary's Church today - Sunday 11April at 3pm.

In 1931, Jesus appeared to a Polish nun called St Faustina. He asked St Faustina to paint an image of Him exactly as she saw Him, with the words "Jesus, I trust in You" written underneath. As St Faustina's visions of Jesus continued, He requested that she start devotion to the Divine Mercy, in which we are asked to recall that God is merciful, that we should be merciful, and to completely trust in Jesus.

Of the requests that Jesus made, the most important was that a feast to the Divine Mercy be celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Pope St John Paul II instituted Divine Mercy in 2000, which we celebrate this Sunday 11 April.

Liam Hayes RIP also got £1,000 to help the poorest of the poor in Argentina. Hopefully the shop will be able to open when restrictions are lifted. In the meantime we really appreciate the financial support since the shop closed.
