FURTHER COVID-19 GUIDELINES issued by Department of Health for Nr. Ireland

- FACE COVERINGS It is mandatory in civil law that face coverings are worn when entering or leaving church and in church. The wearing of a face covering is mandatory unless a person has a reasonable excuse. For example a child under 13 years or a person leading a service in a place of worship or a couple at a ceremony to solemnise their marriage
- FUNERAL OR WAKE Indoor Gathering at Private Dwelling. It is illegal to attend a funeral 2. or wake in a private dwelling
- 3. MARRIAGES – It is illegal to organise, or participate in a gathering of more than 25 persons for the purpose of solemnising a marriage
- FUNERALS AND COMMITTALS It is illegal to organise, operate or participate in a gathering of more than 25 persons for the purpose of a funeral or the committal of a body. It is only possible to view a body in a funeral home. A person responsible for organising or operating a funeral or associated event elsewhere must comply with the guidance on funerals issued by the Department of Health. WHAT FAITH DOES

To separate the two great commandments is a tragedy and goes clean contrary to the Gospel. Yet unfortunately this often happens. Those who have Faith often have no love, and those who love often have no Faith. Thus the Gospel has been torn in two. Jesus spoke of two great commandments. The first – that we should love God. The second – that we should love our neighbour. He didn't say that they were the same thing, but that they are like two sides of the one coin. If we want the total Gospel, we must have both.

He himself showed us how to do this.
